BADMINTON

The badminton section of the AAC is currently composed of about 200 athletes and is one of the best schools of badminton in a country where this sport has a greater visibility within the practice of sport at school and having Pedro Martins and Telma Santos as Portuguese Olympic athletes. BASKETBALL

With an important tradition in Coimbra, basketball is a loved sport with several strong male and female teams.

FUTSAL

Over the last few years, Portuguese futsal went from the most practiced sport recreation to the most practiced indoor sport with larger perspectives of improvement. During the last 4th editions, Ricardinho, a Portuguese player, was considered the best world futsal player.

FOOTBALL

Football is the most important, successful and played sport in Portugal. Portugal has formed three players recognized with a Gold Ball. This sport moves thousands of spectators to the stadiums every week and Coimbra is not an exception.

HANDBALL

Handball is one of the most played indoor sports currently with 40,000 federated athletes in Portugal. Handball has about 28% of participants in school taking it as a subject with an average of 5000 students per year.

TABLE TENNIS

Table Tennis is the Olympic sport with the highest number of players worldwide. Portuguese Table Tennis is currently an international reference among youngsters having Marco Freitas as a role model.

Competition Venue: Coimbra University Stadium

TENNIS

With an athlete in the top 50, João Sousa, Portugal hosts ATP and WTA Estoril Open tournaments (the latter now renamed to Portugal Open). In 2010, the 7th European University Tennis Championship was held in Coimbra which came as a chance to promote tennis as a growing national school sport activity.

VOLLEYBALL

This sport requires great speed and game dynamics, being one of the team sports with the highest number of players in Portugal and showing a great development in the school curricula as well as outstanding results within the national main team, namely in the World League.

ROWING

Portugal is the country of the Olympic finalist athletes Fraga and Mendes. In Coimbra, this sport has a very strong connection to the Mondego river that runs through the city, offering the necessary conditions for the organization of an international regatta for over 22 years, leading to the enthusiastic practice of a sport with strong university traditions.

Competition Venue: High Performance Center of Montemor-o-Velho (CAR)

JUDO

After 50 years of Judo practice in Coimbra, the city hosted the 2nd European University Championships in 2013, a fair prize for a sport practised in many clubs in the city, including AAC which became a national champion having João Neto as its Olympic judoka.

RUGBY 7s

With a regular presence in the world circuit Rugby Sevens is already a booming sport in Portugal. AAC holds the position as one of the strongest competitors in university and absolute national championships, representing a known tradition of rugby as a college/ university sport.

CANOE SPRINT

Portugal has a big tradition and good results in this sport. Near Coimbra we have the city of Montemor-o-Velho with the odd conditions for canoeing as well as the necessary conditions and infrastructures to welcome international events.
