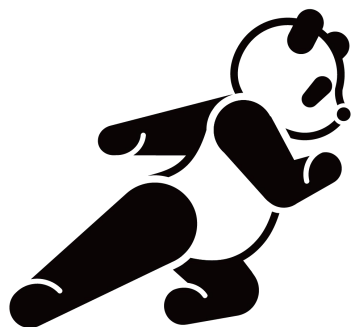

4. General Information

4.1. Country and City

4.1.1. China

Located in Eastern Asia and next to the Western Pacific Ocean, China has around 9.6 million square kilometers of land area, more than 18,000 kilometers of coastline to the east and south and about 4.7 million square kilometers of water area in its inland and marginal seas. More than 7600 islands are dotted around its territorial waters, with Taiwan being the biggest island, covering 35,798 square kilometers. China borders 14 countries and is adjacent to eight countries via sea. Its administrative division includes four municipalities directly under the Central Government, 23 provinces, five autonomous regions and two special administrative regions. Beijing is its capital city.

4.1.2. Chengdu

Chengdu, known colloquially as "Rong," is the capital of Sichuan province. As a national central city and an emerging world city, it's an important national centre of economics, science, technology, finance, cultural and creative industries and foreign exchange, in addition to being an international transportation and communication hub. Known as the "Land of Abundance", Chengdu is home to approximately 16 million permanent residents. Chengdu is a famous historical and cultural city in China, and it's the origin of the ancient Shu civilisation and Taoism with over 4500 years of urban civilisation and 2300 thousand years of history as a city. As the first Asian city recognised by UNESCO as a City of Gastronomy, Chengdu boasts its world-renowned Sichuan cuisine, its exquisite and diverse local delicacies and its spicy, tongue-numbing and delicious hotpot. Chengdu, the home of the giant panda, China's national treasure, is also home to world natural and cultural heritage sites including Mount Qingcheng, the Dujiangyan Irrigation System and the Sichuan Giant Panda Sanctuaries and it has been recognised as the best tourist destination in China by the National Tourism Administration and the World Tourism Organisation.

4.1.3. Climate and Weather Information

a. Climate

Located on the west side of the Sichuan basin, Chengdu has a humid sub-tropical monsoon climate characterised by mild weather with no extreme heat during the summer, little snow during the winter, a long frost-free period, plenty of precipitation during the autumn and at night, low wind speeds and high humidity.

Its average annual temperature is 16.1°C. Its average annual precipitation is 922.7 mm, and its average annual humidity 81%.

b. Weather in Late June and Early July

It's a relatively hot period of the year. The temperature averages 24.4°C in late June and 24.8°C in early July, and goes up gradually in between. This comes with abundant precipitation and high humidity. The average wind speeds are relatively low and horizontal visibility is high, despite the occasional occurrence of severe convective weather.

- Temperature

The average temperature is 24.4°C in late June and 24.8°C in early July, and the difference between day and night is about 12°C. The temperature is stable, with the highest temperatures during the day ranging from 31°C to 37°C.

- Precipitation

With an average rainfall of 103.5 mm, this period has more rain than other months. It mostly rains at night and only for a short duration of about 1-3 hours in the daytime. Frequent heavy rainfall which would severely impact the competition is not expected.

- Humidity

The average humidity between late June and early July is 82%, minimum 35% and maximum 100%.

- Wind

There is often wind-free or very low wind speeds from late June to early July, with an average wind speed of 1.2 m/s. Northerly wind or northeasterly wind prevails, with the lowest wind speeds from the wee hours to 8 am. Winds gather speed at noon and slow down in the evening. Convective gusts occur occasionally with a very short duration usually within 30 minutes.

-Visibility

The period from late June to early July has high visibility and little fog. The average horizontal visibility is 13.2 km, with a highest visibility of 45.6 km and a lowest visibility of 4.0 km.

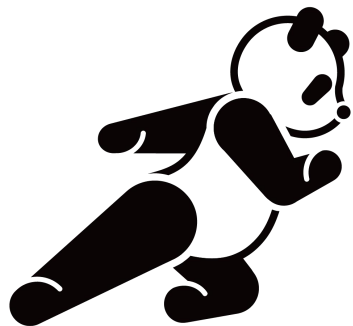

5. Service Information

5.1. Arrival and Departure

- a. All client groups can enter and exit China via Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport (the official port of entry). In addition, Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport, Chengdu Tianfu International Airport and Chengdudong Railway Station are set as the official points of arrival and departure with service desks where the staff of the 2021 FISU WUG will guide and assist the Customs clearance. Transportation services are available from the points of arrival and departure to the residence.
- b. To ensure the convenient and efficient arrival and departure services, participants are suggested to submit the arrival and departure information to the Organising Committee in a timely manner via FISU Online Accreditation System (OAS). In case of any change, please modify the information in time through the Delegation Attaché or the corresponding department.

5.2. FISU World University Games Village

5.2.1. Overview

The FISU WUG Village is located on the campus of Chengdu University in east downtown Chengdu, taking up approximately 800,000 square metres. It is 46 kilometres southeast of Chengdu Tianfu International Airport, 26 kilometres southwest of Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport and 12 kilometres south of Dong'an Lake Sports Park Stadium. It is 44 kilometres from the farthest competition venue for Athletics -- Tanghu Middle School Stadium, and 0.2 kilometres from the nearest Athletics competition venue -- Chengdu University Athletics Training Field A. The FISU WUG Village will open and accept check-in on 20 June 2022, and will close on 10 July 2022, operating for a total of 21 days. Both 5G and Wi-Fi are available across the village. The FISU WUG Village consists of the operational zone, an international zone, a residential zone and transportation areas.

5.2.2. Operational Zone

The operational zone includes the following: the Welcome Centre, Village Pass Centre and Accreditation Centre. Bank services are provided in the Welcome Centre, where a waiting area with drinks and snacks is set.

5.2.3. International Zone

The international zone serves as an important communication platform for delegations. It includes the following facilities: flag plaza, Main Information Centre, Sport Information Centre, FISU Office and meeting rooms, polyclinic, doping control station, volleyball courts, basketball courts, athletic field, swimming pool, post office, mobile services, tourist information services, barber shop, dry cleaner, licensed product stores, souvenir stores, café, games room, dance club, internet café, cinema, religious centre, volunteer centre, education activities and exhibition centre, and cultural activities centre.

5.2.4. Residential Zone

The residential zone provides accommodation and dining services during delegations' stay in the FISU WUG Village. It consists of Zone A in the west, Zone B in the north and Zone C in the east (see the red zones in the FISU WUG Village Map). All three zones have access to the international zone. There is also the Resident Services Centre, delegation offices, medical rooms and laundry rooms in the residential zone. If you need bed extensions, please register at the Resident Services Centre.

5.2.5. Transportation Areas

The transportation areas provide transportation services for delegations to and from competition and training venues and activity sites. They include the following: a transport mall, a parking lot and a vehicle motor pool.

5.3. Accreditation

5.4. Transportation

5.4.1. Transportation for Competition and Training of Athletes and Delegation Officials

-Shuttle bus (Competition)

The OC will arrange the shuttle bus timetable according to the competition schedule, provide shuttle service between the FISU WUG Village and competition venues.

The schedule of the shuttle bus will reserve warm-up time upon arrival at the competition venue for athletes. Athletes and team officials can board the shuttle bus at the bus station located in the FISU WUG Village.

In circumstance that athletes and team officials miss the last bus departing from the competition venue after the game due to doping testing, press conferences or other external reasons, the executive committee will arrange vehicles to transport athletes and team officials back to FISU WUG Village from case to case.

-Shuttle bus (Training)

The executive committee will arrange the shuttle bus timetable according to the training schedule, provide shuttle service between the FISU WUG Village and the training venue on a regular frequency. Athletes can board the shuttle bus at the bus station located in the FISU WUG Village.

5.4.2 Transportation for Opening and Closing Ceremonies

The Opening Ceremony will be held at Dong'an Lake Sports Park Stadium, about 20 minutes' drive from the FISU WUG Village while the Closing Ceremony will be held at Chengdu Open Air Music Park, about 25 minutes' drive from the FISU WUG Village.

The Organising Committee will provide dedicated bus services for athletes and delegation officials to and from the FISU WUG Village and the venues for the Opening Ceremony and the Closing Ceremony on 26 June and 7 July 2022 respectively.

Before the Opening/Closing Ceremony, the Organising Committee will assign vehicles transporting delegations to the opening/closing ceremony venue by delegations.

The transportation information, including the pick-up time, vehicle details and pick-up point, will be sent to the delegations via their liaisons or assistants. All delegations are required to go through security check and arrive at the pick-up point 15 minutes before the pick-up time. After the Opening/Closing Ceremony, delegations going back to the FISU WUG Village will be picked up at the designated points in the Opening/Closing Ceremony Venue. The delegation members may take any bus with unoccupied seats. A bus will depart once it is full. Please refer to the Transportation Manual for the pick-up points after the ceremonies.

5.4.3 Transportation for Spectating Delegation Members

Spectating athletes will be provided with spectating buses to and from between the FISU WUG Village and the competition venues. The bus will depart from the Transport Mall in FISU WUG Village once it is full regardless of nationalities and participating sports of the passengers. The spectating athletes should get off the bus outside the security perimeter (to be confirmed) and walk into the venue with their accreditation card or ticket. If the athletes want to watch the competition of any sport, they can go to the venue by taking the shuttle buses for the competition of such sport.

5.4.4 Delegation Cars

- Assignment and USE

Delegation cars with drivers will be provided for the athletes and officials of each delegation according to the delegation size on the principles specified in the following table:

After the athletes and delegation officials collect their accreditation cards in the FISU WUG Village, the HoD or his/her designated personnel can sign the vehicle use agreement at the Information Desk of the Department of Transportation in the Main Information Centre. Upon the signing of the agreement, the delegation will be entitled to use the delegation cars. The liaison of a delegation will be informed of such vehicle details as the license plate number, parking position and driver's contact for the convenience of athletes and delegation officials to make reservations.

- Service Policy

The delegation cars will be available between 07:00 and 23:00 from 20 June to 10 July 2022. The athletes and delegation officials requesting the delegation cars should make reservations three hours in advance via the delegation liaison or by filling in the transportation information on the 2021 FISU WUG Transportation APP. The delegation cars should only be used within the service hours.

Only the drivers assigned by the transportation service provider are allowed to drive the delegation cars.


5.5. Food and Beverages


5.5.1. Main Dining Hall

Athletes dining hall No. 1 and No. 2 are respectively located near the residential area A and C of the FISU WUG Village, with a total floor area of 17,000 square meters. A total of 4,340 seats are available in the dining halls with a separate halal kitchen and dining area. The hours of operation are as follows:

This timetable is subject to changes.

Accreditation cards with  symbol give unlimited access to the athletes' dining halls. Otherwise, a valid voucher will be required to

access the dining halls. If there is no  symbol on the accreditation card, then no food is allowed to be taken out of the dining halls unless otherwise specified.

5.5.2. Menu

The athletes' dining halls offer hot dishes including Chengdu, Mediterranean, Continental, Asian and Halal cuisines. The menu of hot meals varies on a daily basis, with a rotation of seven days. Cold dishes, room temperature food, dishes cooked over open hearths and cold and hot drinks are available. Alcoholic drinks or fresh juice are not served in the dining halls.

Each dish is served with a food description card in Chinese and English.

5.6. Medical Care

5.6.1. Overview

City-wide medical resources are coordinated to establish a full-process medical service system integrating on-site treatment, emergency transfer, emergency treatment and inpatient treatment and covering all competition and training venues, the FISU WUG Village, the Main Media Centre and official hotels to meet the needs of athletes, TOs, FISU Family, media, staff, and volunteers. The Polyclinic in the FISU WUG Village provides 24-hour medical services.

Free medical services including on-site treatment, emergency transfer and inpatient treatment of acute diseases will be provided for all accredited personnel during the 2021 FISU WUG from 20 June to 10 July 2022. The fee exemption is only applicable to the expenses incurred in China.

Smoking is not allowed in all venues, indoor spaces in the FISU WUG Village, public transportation vehicles, and outdoor spaces other than the designated smoking areas.

5.6.2. Polyclinic

The Polyclinic consists of 16 departments and wards, including emergency, medicine, surgery, orthopaedics and traumatology, sport medicine, dermatology, gynaecology, stomatology, ENT (Ear, Nose and Throat), ophthalmology, imaging (CT, X-ray, colour ultrasound), electrocardiogram, iatrophysics and rehabilitation, a laboratory, a pharmacy and a fever and bowel clinic with isolation rooms. Medical services are provided by the medical staff of the Polyclinic. Medical services are available from 08:00 to 23:00 while first aid and emergency transfer services are available 24 hours a day.

On-site treatment and emergency transfer services are provided for all accredited personnel in the venues.

5.6.4 Designated Hospitals

The hospitals for the Games include nearby and referral hospitals. All of them have green channels and reserved beds to provide medical services for the accredited persons.

5.6.4.1. Nearby Hospitals

Nearby hospitals are designated based on their distance to venues and the service capacities to provide medical services for the Games. In case of medical emergencies, athletes, other participants and staff will be transferred to the nearby hospitals for emergency treatment. Spectators will be transferred to the corresponding medical institutions via the urban public emergency system.

5.6.4.2 Referral hospitals

Referral hospitals will provide medical services for all client groups in the closed loop on patient-specific basis. If any client groups require further treatment as determined by the on-site medical point or the nearby hospital upon the preliminary diagnosis and treatment, they will be transferred to the corresponding referral hospitals.

5.7. Ticketing

Dedicated seating areas will be reserved for athletes and technical officials at the competition venues. Athletes and technical officials can enter these seating areas by presenting their accreditation cards.

5.8. Climate and Weather

From three days before the first Athletics match until the end of the last match, the competition venue weather forecast for the following 24 hours will be reported every day at 08:00 am, including the temperature, air pressure, relative humidity, wind speed, wind direction and precipitation.

6. Competition Information

6.1. Technical Committee

In accordance with Article 3.6.1 of the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games, a Technical Committee for Athletics is set up, which consists of:

No more than two members of the Technical Committee should be of the same nationality, not including the FISU TCC.

6.2. Technical Regulations

- 6.2.1. The athletics events will be organised in accordance with the latest World Athletics Competition and Technical Rules. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be regarded as authoritative.
- 6.2.2. The programme and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the FISU Executive Committee in agreement with the OC and the FISU WUG Summer ITC. In principle, the programme shall last for six days and include the following events:

c. A Team Classification will be established for men and women in the 20km walk and half marathon events.

Each country/region is authorised to enter in:

a. individual event: two (2) athletes both of whom have achieved the entry standard for the event during 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form or one athlete who has not achieved the entry standard;

b. relay event: one (1) team with maximum four (4) athletes for each event.

- If a country/region has already entered Two (2) or more athletes in the events of 100/200m (in relation to 4x100m relay) or 400m (in relation to 4x400m relay), it can only enter maximum of two (2) or more athletes for relay event only. For example: if three (3) athletes are entered in 100/200m, only two (2) additional athletes can be accepted for 4x100m relay entry.

- If a country/region has entered one (1) athlete or less in the events of 100/200 m (in relation to 4x100m relay) or in 400m (in relation to 4x400m relay), its relay team may be filled up to a maximum of four (4) athletes. For example: if one (1) athlete is entered in 100/200m, three(3) additional athletes can be accepted for 4x100m relay entry.

c. For men's and women's 10,000m events, a maximum of three (3) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of that event during 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form or two (2) who have not achieved the entry standard.

d. For men's and women's half-marathon and 20km walk events.

- maximum of five (5) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of that event during 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form or three (3) who have not achieved the entry standard.

- Each delegation entering a race walk or half-marathon team events shall take part with a minimum of three (3) and maximum of five (5) athletes.

- The the times (results) of the first three (3) finished athletes of each team shall be added up in order to determine the team ranking. The team with the shortest added-up times (results) is the winner, and so on.

- A tie shall be resolved in favor of the team whose last scoring athlete finished with a shorter time.

- All finished athletes shall be ranked individually and shall be eligible for individual awards.

- A team with less than three finished athletes will not be ranked in the team result.

6.2.3. No later than 12:00AM one (1) day prior the General Technical Meeting the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official lists of all athletes at the Sport Information Centre (SIC) in the FISU WUG Village.

The final confirmation of each event for the first day's competition shall be made by the Head of Delegation or his/her representative no later than 12:00 AM on the day of the General Technical Meeting (28 June) at the SIC.

The final confirmation for the remaining days' competition shall be made no later than 09:00 AM one (1) day prior to the first round of each event at the SIC or the Technical Information Centre (TIC) located in the competition venue.

Any entry not duly confirmed will not be taken into consideration except for force majeure.

6.2.4. Entry Standards

The entry standards for all events should be achieved during 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form.

6.2.5. Advanced Payment

Two months before the opening ceremony of the FISU World University Games, entered Athletes of each country/region must confirm their participation with an advanced payment of 50% of the participation fees per entered athlete and official.

The advanced payment shall be directly paid to the OC.

6.3. Competition Format

6.3.1. Track Events

The rounds of competition will be arranged in accordance with the World Athletics Rule 20 of Technical Rules (TR20) by applying the World Athletics Track Events rounds, heats and progression tables, based on the number of participants calculated after the closing date for entries.

a. For events of 100m to 800m inclusive, there are three successive rounds of competition (first round, semi-final and final).

b. For events of 1,500m and 5,000m, two rounds of races shall be contested (first round and final).

c. The 10,000m and the road events only have final competition. Athletes who are lapped for the second time in the 10000m race shall be stopped by competition officials and quit the race immediately. They will be classified in the order in which they were before being removed from the race and behind the last finishing athlete.

6.3.2. Field Events

The Qualification Rounds shall be held if the number of participants is too large to allow the competition to be conducted in a single round (final). The qualifying standards for the finals will be decided by the Technical Committee. If twelve (12) or more athletes have reached the qualifying standard, all of them will be in the Final. The qualifying standards as well as the starting height and subsequent raising heights of High Jump and Pole Vault will be announced at the General Technical Meeting.

6.3.3. Half Marathon

Athletes for Half Marathon shall run four (4) loops, and the distance indications will be displayed in kilometers.

Athletes shall report at the Call Room (near the start area) 30 minutes and arrive at starting line 10 minutes before the race start. Transponder Timing Chips will be distributed at the Call Room before the competition.

Retiring from the Race: Should an athlete be unable to continue the race due to physical difficulties, he/she must inform the nearest Competition Official, indicating that he/she would like to abandon the race. To properly indicate the intention of retirement from the race, the athlete is asked to remove his/her bibs.

As shown on the course map (see Appendix “?”), there are Refreshment Stations every 5 km and drinking/Sponging Stations every 2.5 km along the course. In the Refreshment Stations the first and last table will be placed with drinking water by the OC, and from the second table will be the personal refreshment tables.

Each team will have its own table that will be marked with its national / regional flag and the FISU Member Federation Code (e.g. China = CHN). The tables will be arranged in alphabetical order according to this code.

Personal refreshments must be taken to the Refreshment Stations directly by team officials. Transportation will be available to the Refreshment Stations, leaving the start area 10 minutes prior to the start (06:50 AM on 5 July). For those athletes who do not have any team officials with them, bottles should be collected in the Call Room at least 30 minutes before the race start. The OC will provide bottles for personal refreshments and adhesive labels at the SIC. The athletes may also be able to use their own bottles.

Team officials are permitted to hand over the personal refreshments to their athletes at the Refreshment Stations but are not allowed to leave the designated area to follow the athletes on the course. Two (2) officials from each delegation will have access to the Refreshment Station. The special passes to access the Refreshment Stations will be distributed at the TIC.

At the Drinking / Sponging Station the OC will provide the non-refrigerated water in sealed bottles and wet sponges.

On the first and last table in the Refreshment Station the OC will provide the non-refrigerated water in sealed bottles.

It is prohibited to obtain food, water, ice, etc. from the places other than the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / sponging Stations.

Toilets will be available at the end of the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / Sponge Station.

There shall be two mist stations along the course. The water is sprayed from above. The athletes may choose whether to use the mist stations at discretion. There are signs 50 metres in front of the mist stations.

First-aid stations and ambulances will be available at the start/finish areas and designed places on the course.

6.3.4. 20km Walk

The start/finish line of 20km Walk is the same as that of Half

Marathon. The course is a 1km loop and athletes must walk 20 loops. Athletes shall report at the Call Room (near the start area) 30 minutes and arrive at starting line 10 minutes before the race start. Transponder Timing Chips will be distributed at the Call Room before the competition.

Disqualification: Should the Chief Judge or a Chief Judge's Assistant inform an athlete of his/her disqualification, the disqualified athlete is required to leave the course immediately, removing bibs and transponder, and to going directly to the Post Event Control Center. Electronic posting boards displaying the red cards and disqualifications will be placed beside the course.

Retiring from the Race: Should an athlete be unable to continue the race due to physical difficulties, he/she must inform the nearest Competition Official, indicating that he/she would like to abandon the race. To properly indicate the intention of retirement from the race, the athlete is asked to remove his/ her bibs.

As shown on the course map (see Appendix “?”), there is one Refreshment Station and Drinking / Sponging Station each loop. In the Refreshment Station the first and last table will be placed with drinking water by the OC, and from the second table will be the personal refreshment tables. Each team will have its own table that will be marked with its national/regional flag and the FISU Member Federation Code (e.g. China = CHN). The tables will be arranged in alphabetical order according to this code. Personal refreshments must be taken to the Refreshment Stations directly by team officials. The OC will provide bottles for personal refreshments and adhesive labels at the SIC. The athletes may also be able to use their own bottles.

Team officials are permitted to hand over the personal refreshments to their athletes at the Refreshment Stations but are not allowed to leave the designated area to follow the athletes on the course. Two (2) officials from each delegation will have access to the Refreshment Station. The special passes to access the Refreshment Station will be distributed at the TIC.

At the Drinking / Sponging Station the OC will provide the non-refrigerated water in sealed bottles and wet sponges.

On the first and last table in the Refreshment Station the OC will provide the non-refrigerated still water in sealed bottles.

It is prohibited to obtain food, water, ice, etc. from the places other than the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / sponging Station.

Toilets will be available at the end of the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / Sponge Station.

There shall be two mist stations along the course. The water is sprayed from above. The athletes may choose whether to use the mist stations at discretion. There are signs 50 metres in front of the mist stations.

First-aid stations and ambulances will be available at the start / finish areas and the turning points.

6.3.5. Combined Events

a. The Men's Decathlon shall be held on two consecutive days in the following order:

Day 1: 100m, Long Jump, Shot Put, High Jump, 400m.

Day 2: 110m Hurdles, Discus Throw, Pole Vault, Javelin Throw, 1,500m.

b. The Women's Heptathlon shall be held on two consecutive days in the following order:

Day 1: 100m Hurdles, High Jump, Shot Put, 200m.

Day 2: Long Jump, Javelin Throw, 800m.

The latest World Athletics Combined Events scoring tables will be applied.

6.3.6. Relay Races

All delegations must submit the list of athletes entered in the relay race to the TIC in accordance with the order of legs at least one hour before the commencement of the 1st Heat of the race. There shall be only four (4) alternates once the competition begins.

6.3.7. Withdrawal

Withdrawal from competition, a formal withdrawal form must be completed and submitted to the TIC.

6.3.8. Call Room Procedure

a. The final Call Room for events other than the throws and road events is located in place between the Warm-up Area and the FOP with clear signs. Athletes will be ushered into it by Technical Official or volunteers.

b. The First Call Room for throws is located at the warm-up area for throws at Tanghu Middle School, and shuttle bus will be arranged nearby for transporting athletes to the final Call Room of Shuangliu Sports Centre.

c. The Call Room for road events is located adjacent to the start area of the Half Marathon and the 20km Walk.

d. Athletes who compete in Combined Events shall report to the Final Call Room before the first event of each day. The roll-calling procedures for the subsequent events will be carried out in the athlete lounge of Combined Events before the start of each event. The Referee for combined events will inform athletes about the competition timetable in advance. Each athlete will collect a pass at the TIC one day before the start of competition, pass holders will be allowed to enter the lounge. The lounge shall be furnished with massage couch, beverage and refreshments, as well as toilets and showering facilities. The results and accumulating scores of all events can be checked in the lounge.

e. The athletes will be ushered from the Call Room to the FOP in accordance with the timetable:

(Athletes participating in throws need to go through the First Call Room for throws at Tanghu Middle School before taking the shuttle bus to the final call room.)

f. The procedures in the Call Room will be as follows:

- Confirmation of the identification of athletes by means of their Accreditation Cards and bib numbers.
- Checking of athletes' uniform.
- Inspection of personal belongings and prohibited items.
- Checking for compliance with FISU and World Athletics Advertising Regulations.
- Checking of shoes and spikes.

Team Leaders must ensure that all their athletes comply with the above before entering the Call Room. After completion of these procedures, athletes must follow the instructions given by the officials at the Call Room before being taken onto the Field of Play.

g. In accordance with World Athletics Rule 6 (TR6.3), personal belongings (camera, recording equipment, radio, CD player, radio transmitters, MP3/MP4, mobile phone and similar items) cannot be brought into the FOP, Call Room judges will temporarily keep them and provide athletes with receipts. After the competition, they may take back these items from the Post Event Control Centre by presenting those receipts. At the end of each competition day, uncollected items will be stored at the TIC.

h. A specific Call Room Schedule will be produced for each session of competition and published on the notice boards at the SIC, as well as the TIC and in the warm-up areas. The exact roll-calling time for each event will be displayed.

Competitors who fail to show up on time at the relevant Call Room without a valid reason (e.g. a medical certificate delivered by the official doctor of the FISU WUG) shall be excluded from participating in this and all further events in the athletics competition of FISU WUG, including relays.

i. Accreditation Cards for competing athletes will be collected at

the Call Room and returned upon the completion of their respective events at the Post Event Control Centre.

j. Team officials and escorts are not allowed to enter the Call Room.

6.3.9. Pre-competition Procedures

- a. Field events: each athlete participating in field events may have at least two practice trials at the FOP, which will be in draw order.
- b. Track events: The athletes shall keep their clothing and backpacks in the final Call Room and take them back from the Post Event Control Centre after the competition.

6.3.10. Start commands

The commands of the Starter shall be given in English.

- a. The commands in races up to 400m and 4x400m relay shall be:
 - On your marks
 - Set
 - Firing of the starting gun.
- b. The commands in races of 800m and over shall be:
 - On your marks
 - Firing of the starting gun.

6.3.11. Sport Presentation

Before the competition of semi-final or final of each track event and the final of field events, all athletes will be introduced in accordance with the lane/order of competition.

6.3.12. Leaving the FOP

During the competition, an athlete shall inform the chief Judge before leaving the competition area and cannot leave without being accompanied by judge (s). In the field events, the athletes who have achieved the qualifying standard and advanced into the final and those who have been eliminated in the finals of High Jump and Pole Vault shall be led by the relevant judges to leave the FOP after the competition of each round or each height. The three highest ranked athletes shall leave competition area together.

6.3.13. Mixed Zone

All athletes must leave the competition area by going through the Mixed Zone, which is adjacent to the finish line (on the right side) and will be clearly indicated. The Mixed Zone for Race Walking and Half Marathon will be behind the finish line.

6.3.14. Post Event Control Centre

Athletes may receive their personal belongings and accreditation cards at the Post Event Control Centre. The items kept at the final Call Room will be returned to the athletes there. The doping control chaperons will complete the written official notices with the athletes concerned, and escort the latter to the doping control centre.

The top three ranked athletes will be ushered by a designated person waiting for the Medal Ceremony.

6.3.15. Disqualification

In accordance with the World Athletics Technical Rules Article 4.4 (TR4.4.), any explanation for the reason of failure in taking part in competition must be approved by the TCC. The qualification in the following circumstances will prevent an athlete from taking part in competition of any further events (including relay events):

- a. If an athlete confirms his/her participation in the competition of an event but fails to participate and does not give a reasonable explanation, the reason for his/her failure in taking part in the competition shall be submitted to the TIC before the roll-calling time of the event.
- b. If an athlete has qualified through the preliminary/qualifying competition, but does not take part in the next round of competition and gives a reasonable explanation, the reasons for his/her failure in taking part in the competition shall be submitted to the TIC before the roll-calling time of the event.

6.3.16. Results

Official results will be displayed on the stadium scoreboard. All the results, as well as the next day's program, will be available on the noticeboard in the TIC at the Shuangliu Sport Center Stadium. The same papers will be available after each day's session in the SIC at the Athletes' Village.

6.3.17. Coaches Area

The coaches area is located at the designated seats at the front row, adjacent to the FOPs of field events, facilitating communication between coaches and athletes.

Based on the final confirmation of the athletes taking part in the competition, one ticket for the coach of each participating athlete will be distributed at the TIC for him/her to enter the Coaches Area.

6.4. Sport Entries and Eligibility

- 6.4.1. Only delegations with athletes will be approved as official delegations participating in the FISU World University Games. (cf. Article 5.2 of The Entry Deadlines in the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games) are as follow:

Entry Requirements

The forms of Intention for Participation, General Entry Information, Entry Quantitative, Nominative and Individual Entries shall be submitted through the FISU Online Accreditation System in order to meet the required entry deadlines. The entries for International Technical Official (ITO) shall be submitted to OC pursuant to applicable procedures and deadline.

- Entries submitted after the required deadlines will not be taken into consideration, except in the event of force majeure. Late entries will be kept on a reserve list and evaluated by FISU case by case.

- Individual Entry forms of athletes from a non-Member Association must be countersigned by the NF or by the NOC. The NF of the concerned sport or the NOC has to submit an official request to FISU General Secretariat. Upon approval FISU will provide them an access to the FISU Online Accreditation System.

6.4.2. Eligibility

The International Control Committee (CIC) shall be responsible for controlling the eligibility of athletes and accreditation of delegations, officials and athletes at the FISU World University Games;

At the individual entry deadline, one month prior to the opening ceremony of the FISU World University Games, the CIC shall verify and validate the documents submitted by the delegations in the FISU Online Accreditation System to justify, in particular:

- a. the authenticity of the national entries (cf. Article 1.5 of the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games)
- b. the academic status of the athletes (cf. Article 5.2.2 and 5.2.3 of the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games)
- c. the nationality and age of the athletes (cf. Article 5.2.4 of the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games)

- 6.9.1. There shall be a Technical Committee for each sport in the programme of a FISU World University Games, which shall consist of:
- at least one (1) FISU TCC who shall be a member of the FISU WUG Summer ITC for the sport concerned;
 - one (1) representative of the OC for the sport concerned;
 - the Technical Delegate of the appropriate NF of the organising country;
 - the Technical Delegate of the appropriate IF;
 - additional experts who may be appointed to assist the Technical Committee as appropriate.

The Technical Committee will be assisted in its work by adequate personnel.

The OC shall appoint one administrative secretary to the Technical Committee who shall take the minutes of all meetings.

- 6.9.2. During the days prior to the start of the sports events for which he/she is responsible, the FISU TCC shall convene the following meetings:
- the meeting of the Technical Committee, which the staff members of the OC for the sport concerned may also attend as observers;
 - the General Technical Meeting, to which the members of the Technical Committee and a representative from each country competing in the sport concerned shall be invited.
- 6.9.3. The first meeting of the Technical Committee shall:
- prepare the General Technical Meeting;
 - define the criteria for setting up a jury of appeal (if appropriate according to the rules and regulations of the IF);
 - decide on the appointment system for Technical Officials (TOs);
 - approve the detailed programme for their sport;
 - propose the nomination of additional experts to assist the Technical Committee as appropriate.
- 6.9.4. The General Technical Meeting will be held at 15:00 on 28 June 2021 at the FISU WUG Village. Each delegation can assign two persons (one interpreter will be included if necessary) to attend the meeting.

The meeting will be presided over by the TCC and conducted in English.

 - inspect the sport facilities and the equipment to be used during the competitions;

Art 4.6.e of the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games) in one official copy and submit it to FISU no later than 48 hours after the end of the competitions.

6.9.7. After the FISU World University Games, each FISU TCC has to present a report per sport, which shall include recommendations for the future FISU World University Games .

6.10. Technical Officials

6.10.1. Nomination

All international technical officials are nominated and selected by the FISU Athletics Technical Committee Chair and World Athletics. Those ITOs must be invited by the OC no less than three months before the opening ceremony of the FISU World University Games.

The OC and the NF will appoint NTOs to complement the team of technical officials required for Athletics competition.

6.10.2. Number of Technical Officials

There shall be twenty (20) ITOs
- 11 ITOs

- 1 Statistician
- 6 International Race Walking Judges
- 1 International Starter
- 1 International Photo Finish Judge

The number of NTOs shall be agreed between the OC and the FISU Athletic TCC.

6.11. Protest and Appeal

Protests and Appeals will be handled in accordance with the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games and the World Athletics Technical Rules Article 8 (TR8) an extract of which appears below. Protests and appeals will be handled by the TIC at the Shuangliu Sport Center Stadium.

6.11.1. Protest

Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event shall be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event.

The OC will be responsible for ensuring that the time of the announcement of all results is recorded.

Any protest shall be made orally to the Referee by an athlete, by someone acting on his/her behalf, or by an official representative of a delegation. Such person or team may protest only if they are competing in the same round of the event to which the protest (or subsequent appeal) relates.

To arrive at a fair decision, the Referee should consider any available evidence that he or she thinks necessary, including a film or picture produced by an official video recorder, or any other available video evidence. The Referee may decide on the protest or may refer the matter to the Jury. If the Referee makes a decision, there shall be a right of appeal to the Jury. Where the Referee is not accessible or available, the protest should be made to him through the TIC.

Note: The relevant Referee shall, after his decision on a protest, immediately inform the TIC of the time of the decision. If the Referee

was unable to communicate this orally to the relevant delegation (s) / athlete (s), the official time of the announcement will be that of posting the decision at the TIC.

6.11.2. Appeal

An appeal to the Jury of Appeal must be made within 30 minutes:

- a. of the official announcement of the amended result of an event arising from the decision made by the Referee; or
- b. of the advice being given to those making the protest, where there is no amendment of any result.

It shall be in writing, signed by the athlete, by someone acting on his/her behalf or by an official representative of a delegation and shall be accompanied by a deposit of USD 100, which will be forfeited if the appeal is not allowed. Such athlete or team may appeal only if they are competing in the same round of the event to which the appeal relates. Any decision of the Jury of Appeal is final and must be reported immediately to the Head of Delegation of the country/region concerned.

6.12. Late-Athlete Replacement Policy

The OC has the right to charge country / region not meeting the Individual Entry deadline with an additional late-entry fee of EUR 200 for each participant entered after the entry deadline. Late entries will only be accepted in special circumstances and with the approval of FISU.

Where an athlete gets injured or ill, the late-athlete replacement policy applies.

6.13. Equipment and Uniforms

6.13.1. Sport equipment

The sport equipment used for track and field events of Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games need to be certified by World Athletics, and provided by the OC.

The OC will provide basic equipment for training and warm up practices. The throwing implements provided by the OC are shown below:

The athletes meeting the following conditions are entitled to use their own throwing implements:

- The throwing implements have been certified by World Athletics.
- The throwing implements are not in the list of throwing implements provided by the OC.
- The throwing implements are in good condition and their brands are easy to identify.
- The throwing implements are available for use by all athletes till the end of final.
- The throwing implements must be delivered to the equipment storage room at the Shuangliu Sport Center Stadium before 19:00 one day prior to the start of competition.

6.13.2. Vaulting Pole

The OC will provide the athletes with vaulting poles transportation and keeping services. All vaulting poles shall be marked by athletes with their names and the name of their country or region.

The athletes arriving at the XX airport and deposit their vaulting poles at the 'Arrival & Departure Service Desk' of the XX airport and receive a receipt from the OC. The vaulting poles will be transported from the XX Airport to the athletic training venue at Chengdu University, and to the FOP of Shuangliu Sports Centre one day before the event, and back to the 'Arrival & Departure Service Desk' of the XX airport after the event, where the athletes take back their vaulting poles by presenting the receipt.

6.13.3. Markers

No athlete will be allowed to use his/her own markers.
 The OC will provide each athlete with two markers for the events of Long Jump, Triple Jump, Pole Vault and Javelin Throw.
 For High Jump, athletes will be provided with two adhesive tapes. Each athlete can only use one marker in the relay events, as per the World Athletics Technical Rule 24.4. These will be distributed in the Call Room.
 For Shot Put, Discus Throw and Hammer Throw one marker may be used according to World Athletics Technical Rule 25.3.2.
 No chalk powder or pen markers are to be used on any runway.

6.13.4. Clothing

Competing athletes must wear the official uniform of sport federation of their country/region, otherwise they are not allowed to access the FOP and take part in competition.
 Before entering the FOP, the clothing will be checked at the final Call Room.
 At 12:00PM one day before the GTM (27 June, 2021), all delegations must submit photos of their competition uniforms (including vests, shorts, tights and athletic garments) and the Participation Confirmation Form on a USB stick to the SIC.

- JPEG files (maximum resolution and size: 300dpi/500kb)
- Preferably compressed ZIP files.
- The file name must clearly indicate the name of country or region.

This rule applies to competition uniforms (including vests, shorts and tights) and athletic garments.

The OC will comply with detailed stipulations of World Athletics Rule 5 (CR5), World Athletics Advertising Regulations and detailed stipulations on competition clothing in the Regulations. The dressing requirements in the Call Room and the FOP during the competition shall be consistent with the Regulations. Those who do not comply with World Athletics Regulations are not allowed to enter the FOP.

6.13.5. Shoes

Athletes are only allowed to wear World Athletics certified shoes.

a. Spikes: Any number of spikes up to 11 may be used but the number of spike positions shall not exceed 11. Each spike shall not exceed 12mm except in the High Jump and Javelin Throw, otherwise it shall not exceed 9mm. The spike must be so constructed that it will, at least for the half of its length closest to the tip, fit through a square sided 4mm gauge.

6.13.6. Athlete Bibs

Each athlete shall be provided with four bibs which, during the competition, shall be worn visibly on the front of the torso and back, on the back of the track suits, and on the sports bags, except in the Jumping Events, where one bib may be worn on the front of the torso or back only. These bibs must be worn as issued and may not be cut, folded or obscured in any way.

In Relay Races, any athlete of each delegation must wear on his/her chest a bib marked with a three-letter country/region code, and on his/her back an individual bib.

In Track Events, the athletes will be also given two adhesive hip numbers in the Call Room before entering the Field of Play. The hip numbers must be secured to both sides of the athlete's shorts / legs.

In Relay Races, the hip bib shall only be distributed by the judge at the takeover zone to the last athlete of each delegation.

In Combined Events, the athlete with the highest scores will be provided with one leading bib, which shall be worn on the chest and distributed by the Combined Events referee at the Combined Events lounge.

All participating teams are required to verify whether the above requirements have been made in order to prevent from delay of competitions.

6.14. Doping Control

6.14.1. Overview

Doping control (in and out of competition) during the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games will be strictly conducted in accordance with the FISU Anti-Doping Regulations and the 2019 World Anti-Doping Code to ensure a fair competition and promote sound sportsmanship. Doping control will begin from the official opening date of the FISU WUG Village until the end of the Games.

Participating athletes must abide by relevant regulations and follow given guidelines when they have been selected and notified for testing.

Any athlete who refuses to undergo testing, or interferes with the testing process, will be considered to have committed a doping violation and be subject to disciplinary action.

6.14.2. Doping Control Station (DCS)

Doping control stations are designed in accordance with WADA and FISU regulations. Samples for testing are collected in the Doping Control Station of each competition venue as well as at the Doping Control Centre (Doping Control Station) located within the FISU WUG Village.

6.14.3. Athlete Selection

FISU Medical Committee will select athletes based on rank in a competition at random and will do target testing.

6.14.4. Escorting Persons

Athletes will be notified and escorted by at least one chaperone as needed.

6.14.5. Report to Doping Control Station

The athlete must report to the Doping Control Station in a reasonable

amount of time from selection. The athletes will be allowed to attend award ceremonies, press conference, etc., as long as they remain under supervision of his/her chaperone/s.

6.14.6. Sample Collection

Athletes selected for testing will be notified immediately following the competition and will be under constant visual supervision by a chaperone until they enter the Doping Control Station. At the station, sample (urine and/or blood) will be collected in a vessel, then sealed and submitted for transportation to the WADA approved laboratory under the supervision of a Doping Control Officer.

6.14.7. Athletes' Obligations

- a. The athletes must have their Accreditation with them at all times.
- b. The athletes must report all medications taken in the prior week (including nutrition supplements, minerals, vitamins, etc.).
- c. athletes must present their TUE Document if they have one.

6.14.8. Testing Organisation and Results

The collected sample will be tested in the laboratory within 48 hours and results will be directly communicated to the FISU Medical Committee Chair. Athletes who are tested positive in the doping test may be disqualified and subject to disciplinary action.

6.14.9. Additional Controls

A team may request for doping control tests to be performed on an athlete who has not been selected for doping control.

Examples of indications for this request are for National Records, or Target Testing. These athletes must complete the "FISU Doping Control Request Form". They will then be escorted to the Doping Control Station for sample collection and testing. The testing fee shall be borne by the applying unit. The results will be managed by FISU or appropriate national organisation.

6.15. Awards and Medals

A grand and solemn medal ceremony will be held after each competition.

6.15.1. Medal Ceremony

- a. The athletes/teams of the top three places in the finals must attend the medal ceremony.
- b. Ten minutes prior to the ceremony, the medallists will be ushered to the waiting area by the venue sport team coordinator. In case of a no show of medallists, the medals and mascots are delivered to the relevant HoD or appointed delegate.
- c. The medallists are expected to mount the podium in the official team uniforms. However, they are allowed to attend the official ceremony wearing sports uniforms when the ceremony takes place immediately after the competition. The medallists are not allowed to take any National/Regional flag or any other Country/Region, cultural or religious symbol on the podium. They must not wear hats, caps or sunglasses on the podium.
- d. The National/Regional flag or flag of the Games will be raised for

medallists and FISU anthem will be played. All medallists and relevant officials are required to face the flags while they are being raised and the FISU anthem is being played.

e. After the flag-raising ceremony, medallists are expected to take photos with award presenters and then with other medallists.

f. After photos are taken, the medalists shall proceed to the mixed zone for interview and then escorted by the venue sport team staff.

g. Any dispute regarding protocol is resolved by the persons in charge of Protocol within the FISU.

6.15.2. Medals and Mascot

The athletes/teams of the top three places in the finals will be awarded a gold medal, a silver medal and a bronze medal and mascots, respectively. If more than four athletes of a single delegation compete in the semi-final or final of a relay event, only four athletes entering the final competition will attend the medal ceremony, and the rest of the athletes will receive their medals from the TIC. All members of the Race Walk and Half Marathon teams will attend the medal ceremony and receive medals.

6.15.3. Diploma

Diplomas will be awarded in accordance with the FISU Protocol. Please refer to Art. 6.2.2 of the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games General Regulations.

6.15.4. Other awards

No other awards shall be given unless agreed otherwise with FISU.

6.16. Media Interviews

Media centres are set up in all competition venues to facilitate interviews and reports by the accredited media.

After the competitions, all athletes must exit the field of play through the mixed zone, where they will be interviewed by the media.

Athletes will be guided by the press conference room staff to attend the press conference after the medal ceremony.

All press conferences will be supported with English and Chinese interpreting services.

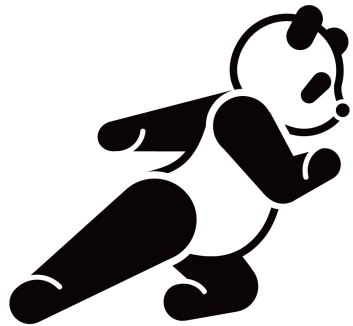
